Four Foundational Theories and Their Public Relationship

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The Active Four-Theory Canon

The Chronicle Framework connects four foundational theories into one developmental sequence:

1. Cellular Theory of Evolution
2. Observation Theory of Reality
3. Bubble Theory of Existence
4. Story Science

The framework asks how life continues, how observation makes reality available, how observers experience existence locally, and how stories preserve observation, meaning, and knowledge across time.

1. Cellular Theory of Evolution

Core principle: Evolution begins as cellular continuity.

The theory proposes that the cell is the first living system that must continue itself. To continue, a cell must interact with its environment, use energy, respond to conditions, reproduce, adapt, and persist. The theory does not replace evolutionary biology. It reframes the starting point of evolutionary explanation around cellular continuation.

2. Observation Theory of Reality

Core principle: Reality requires observation.

The theory proposes that observation is the mechanism through which reality becomes available to an observer. The public framework treats this as a working theoretical claim that must remain distinguishable from established empirical science.

3. Bubble Theory of Existence

Core principle: Existence is experienced locally.

No observer experiences all of existence. Each observer encounters a limited portion shaped by observation, memory, knowledge, experience, limitation, capability, and location. These local observational bubbles can overlap, interact, expand, and change.

4. Story Science

Core principle: Stories preserve observations across time.

Story Science studies how observations become experience, memory, story, meaning, and knowledge, and how those preserved records influence later observation and future development.

How the Layers Connect

- Cellular continuity makes living observers possible.
- Observation makes reality available to an observer.
- The observer inhabits existence through a limited local perspective.
- Experience becomes memory and story.
- Story preserves observations so meaning and knowledge can continue across time.

Relationship to the Updated Foundation

The four-theory Chronicle sequence remains an active public canon structure. The newer dependency foundation, beginning with Difference and Relationship and continuing through Change, Observation, Information, Memory, Persistence, Identity, Becoming, Continuation, and Reality, provides a deeper working substrate. The deeper foundation does not erase the four theories. It gives them a more explicit dependency structure for testing and future expansion.

Public Boundary

The documents are independent conceptual research. Claims that exceed current empirical proof should be presented as working postulates or theories, not as established science. Revision history, source trails, and unresolved questions should remain visible as the work develops.
